Teacher Appreciation Organizer

Sion ALLiance organizes luncheons and treats for teachers and staff throughout the year. We need a person to take over this position and thank our teachers for all they do throughout the year. The Teacher Appreciation organizer works with other volunteer parents to plan and execute appreciation days, which includes two luncheons per year, Teacher Appreciation Week and a special surprise of your choice.

Fine Arts Showcase Organizer(s)
